Programs and Services



C.O.R.E. (Centering Our Resources Efficiently)

Key Anticipated Outcomes:

- Grow to stabilize and maintain housing for low-income families to prevent homelessness and eviction (approximately \$3000 per family at 50 families annually), and utility interruptions (\$1000 per year at up to 1500 families annually).
- Reduce hunger and promote food equity in food desert areas.
- Engage low-income communities in healthy food behaviors, recreation, and social interaction via urban food gardens.



Education to the Core (ETC)

Key Anticipated Outcomes:

- To promote education as a pathway out of poverty by measuring secondary and vocationaleducation completion.
- Provide primary students with opportunities and exposure to decrease poor choices during after-school hours when parents/guardians may not be available due to job and work schedules.



Housing to the Core (HTC)

Key Anticipated Outcomes:

- Increase the number of permanent supportive housing units in new and existing housing developments.
- Increase the number of homeless residents transitioning from permanent housing units into affordable subsidized units to open opportunities for more families in need.
